Communication & Student Success

At Riverbank, we highly value communication. Please remember that you can communicate with your child's teacher through many different modes. You can communicate by note, letter, email, phone calls and face to face conference. Please be aware that we try to return phone calls and emails within twenty-four hours of receiving the message.

In a situation where you may have some concerns about the classroom or your student, please contact the teacher first. If you contact the principal before contacting the teacher, administration will refer you back to the teacher. After meeting with the teacher, if you still have concerns then you may schedule a meeting with one administration (Principal Rabb-Patterson for Preschool-4th grades) (Principal Rodriguez for 5th-8th grades). We believe with strong communication your student will be successful at Riverbank.

School Supervision and Safety

School grounds open at 7:30am at all schools in Washington Unified School District. There is no supervision for students before 7:30am unless your student is participating in the Champions program. For more information please contact Champions through the school office.

Another safety concern is outside access to campus during the school day. Any person wishing to enter the school grounds after 8:10am must sign-in in the office and receive a visitors' pass. If you are on campus without a visitor's pass you will be escorted to the office to receive one. This includes parents who are picking up or dropping off AM and PM Kindergarten students.

Otter PRIDE for August/September

This year we are focusing on our Otter PRIDE. PRIDE stands for Positive Attitude, Respect/Responsibility, Integrity, Determination and Empathy. For August and September, Riverbank is focused on fostering a positive attitude with all students. There are several ways to encourage a positive attitude as a daily habit. One is or create a culture of optimism. Encourage students to look for the 'bright side' in situations. Talk about things that you are grateful for with your students.

Another way to encourage a positive attitude is to help students develop a growth mindset by praising students for the effort in activities instead of their abilities. "I can see how much work you put into that. Great job" instead of "you're so smart". Helping students feel comfortable that learning is a process and that mistakes are okay helps them understand that they can do things even if they haven't mastered them yet. Uniform/Dress Code

Students in all Washington Unified K-8 schools are required to wear a school uniform. This consists of navy blue or khaki pants, slacks, athletic pants, leggings or blue jeans, skirts, shorts, jumpers, etc. with a white or navy blue collared shirt or blouse. Riverbank school t-shirts or sweatshirts may also be worn.

• Dress Code

Keeping your student focused on their studies in a safe learning environment is important to us! School board policy 5132 describes dress code expectations for all students to support us in this effort, *even for students with a uniform waiver on file*. Tennis shoes and clothing suitable for PE are strongly recommended. Any student who is dressed inappropriately will be given uniform clothing to wear.

Cell phone Policy

Our goal at Riverbank is for students to be engaged in academic and social learning activities as often as possible while at school. Using cell phones and electronic devices can be distracting to the learning environment and cause students to miss out on building academic skills and social relationships. Students may bring cell phones/electronic devices to school. However, these items must be turned off and stowed in backpacks once the students enter campus. Cellphones and el chronic devices may not be used during recess, meal times, breaks or passing periods or class time. If a student is caught using a cell phone/electronic device, it will be confiscated. Parents may be asked to pick up the item from the office.

Riverbank School is not responsible for lost or stolen cell phones/electronic devices.
