1st Grade

First graders will be focusing on "Getting to Know Us" in our first Language Arts Unit. Students will learn how to retell stories; describe characters, setting, and key details in a story; as well as learn to use capitalization and end punctuation when they write. In math, students are learning to model and solve addition problems within 20. On October 7, first graders will attend a live-stream performance of The Adventures of Sir Enamel to be entertained while learning about dental health. <u>{Video Link}</u>

Virtual Learning is a new and a stretch for all of us. We are grateful for all of the support from families and the community as we navigate this new way of learning. We recognize the sacrifices that parents, extended family, neighbors are making to help their students do their very best There are several ways that families can support their students in virtual learning no matter what grade your student is in.

- 1. Create a daily routine. Consistent beginning of the day and end of the day routines help keep things normal. Treat online school just like inperson school. Help students get up on time, dress, eat, brush their hair and teeth and gather supplies for school before their first virtual meeting starts.
- 2. Set up a learning space. Create a quiet space with a table, chair, enough light and power supply for technology. Keep school supplies organized near by.
- 3. Limit distractions. Try to limit distractions as much as possible while students are in their virtual classrooms. Turn off TVs or other media and try to keep pets and small children from interrupting the lesson.
- 4. Talk about the Learning. Ask you student about what they are learning in class and what they find interesting.
- 5. Maintain a balance. Don't focus solely on one thing. Take time to do fun things together.
- 6. Ask for support. Your Riverbank family is here for you.
- 7. Stay connected. Maintain relationships with family and friends.



2nd Grade

Second Grade is off to a great start! In reading, we are focusing on the elements of a story. We have read many fairy tales and literature and focused our discussions on character, setting, problems, and solutions. In Math, we are working on learning our doubles facts as well as solving problems with addition and subtraction.

*Mrs. Piles class met virtually with their 5th grade buddies in Ms. Davis's class. The older students will serve as Mentors to the younger students and will be Pen Pals!

4th Grade

Forth grade is using The AVID Binders and the student planners, In ELA, we are working on UNIT 1, narrative writing and we are reading The Island of the Blue Dolphins. For math we are working on Place Value. Students are enjoying PE with Ms. Willow and ART lessons with Ms. Gregory.

5th Grade

Our fifth graders are amazing this year! We are enjoying a realistic fiction novel <u>Runaway Twin</u> by Peg Kehret. The group research project on Natural Disasters ties our interesting book to Science & Social Studies. In Math we are working on Place Value and understanding their relationship to one another. We are utilizing our AVID Planners for assignments and announcements, Ask your child to share it with you!
